# Capacity Building Programme on Life Skills



Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized Cyber Security Awareness Program (Phase 2) on 14.03.2023 in collaboration with the State Project Directorate Tamil Nadu, Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA).

Delivering the presidential address Prof. R. Jagannathan, the Vice Chancellor, pointed out the alarming number of Cyber-crimes against elders, women, and children. Excerpts from his speech: Since we live in the digital world and carry out numerous transactions through online platforms there is every chance that our data security may be compromised. It is of vital importance that students need to be vigilant while using smart devices as we live in an inter-connected world and there is an increase in cyber-attacks every passing day. According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), India reported more than 50000 Cyber Crimes in 2021. A report by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology revealed India witnessed more than 13 lakh Cyber security incidents in 2022. Women face unique cyber security issues making them a more vulnerable segment among internet users. Everyone should be aware of issues on Cyber transactions and take appropriate measures to conduct safe transactions to ward off any misadventures of Cyber criminals.



Ms. B. S. Vijayalakshmi, District Revenue Officer, Project Manager-RUSA felicitated the gathering. She highlighted the need for girl students to be aware of Cyber-attacks and their impact on their physical and mental well-being. She has pointed out the usefulness of this program to students and suggested that by adopting various measures to safeguard themselves from cyber-attacks.

Dr. Rakshit Tandon, Head-Capacity Building Initiative, Cyberpeace Foundation delivered the keynote address. In his speech, he covered five major issues namely, cyber-crime, the impact of Cybercrimes in terms of money, mental health, and Physical Health, The measures available to safeguard oneself from cyber-attacks, the regulatory enrolment related to Cyber and Government organizations Security, Cybercrimes. He also demonstrated how emails and Instagram accounts are hacked by hackers when we access them on mobile phones. He explained how photo morphing is done by hacking one's google drive. The usage and safety measures of Digilocker are explained by the speaker. He showcased the ways through which students can register their complaints against cyber-attacks. He revealed how people carelessly set easy passwords making their accounts vulnerable to hacking. He reiterated that safety has to be the priority in whatever devices, apps, and portals we use.





The students interacted with the speaker and got clarified on the various issues about cyber security, cyber laws, and the ecosystem available to manage cyber issues. The discussion revolved around Industry 4.0, artificial intelligence (AI), and the evolutionary path of the digital world.

Dr. P. Viswanathamurthi, Coordinator-RUSA, Periyar University, had earlier welcomed the gathering. Dr. G. Yoganandan, Director-IQAC, Periyar University delivered the vote of thanks. Deputy Directors - IQAC, and officials from RUSA Directorate, Tamil Nadu facilitated the event. # National Seminar on Folk Elements in Tamil Literature



Department of Tamil organized a Two-day National Seminar on Folk Elements in Tamil literature from 28/03/2023 to 29/03/2023. Prof. T. Periasamy, Professor and Head, the Department of Tamil welcomed the gathering. The programme was presided over by Prof. R. Balagurunathan, Registrar (FAC), Periyar University. In his presidential address, he congratulated the department for organizing the programme and stated that it is a festival of the Tamil department. He said that having Padmashri Awardie Prof. Sirpi Balasubramaniyam as chief guest added more laurels to the programme. He added that the geneses of writing and speaking play a crucial role in a language. The Tamil language being classical, its origin cannot be traced. Such a distinguished and honorable language, Tamil consists of various folk elements in it. Human lifestyle, tradition, politics, and culture are deeply rooted in the Tamil language. He pointed out that right from Sangam Literature to post-modern literature the elements of folk life are inseparable.

Padmasri Prof. Sirpi Balasubramaniyam stated that he is not an expert in folk literature but a keen observer and lover of folk literary productions and folk research. He added that the reason for his participation despite his old age is his curiosity to know how and what kind of contributions the younger generations make in the present scenario. He added that the folk elements are generally oral by tradition. Hero /heroines of the natural soil are portrayed in folk literature with their virtue and flaws as it is. Prof. Sirpi has brought in the context of Sylapathikaram and its origin. There were folk stories resembling Silappathikaram well before it was written. Even the story of Kannahi is a well-known one beyond the nation and the famous story about Kannahi in Sri Lanka is the best example of the same.



Folk arts in connection with Kongu folk stories were performed for the students including Kongu Oylattam, Vallikummi, Perunchalangai attam, and Eason Vallikummi attam by organizer K. Palanivelu's team. Prof. P. Subramanian delivered a talk on Kavadi Padalkal, Prof. P. Nallasivam on 'Folk elements in Isai Padalkal, and Prof. P. Krishnaswamy' on self-esteem in Folk Literature from a Historical Perspective.

Prof. M. Sundaramoorthi delivered the vote of thanks. Faculty members research scholars and students from the University Tamil Department other departments and affiliated Colleges participated in the programme.
